LESSON PLAN : 4 of 5: Chaco Ancestral Site

Students will be able to:

- Investigate, discover, and describe the influence of history, geography, and craft/architecture on communities and cultures.
- Investigate, discover, and describe Pueblo culture and architecture.
- Investigate, discover, and describe aspects of sustainable design.
- Investigate, discover, and describe the essential building elements of any New Mexican architecture.
- Locate and map Acoma Pueblo and other pueblos.
- Demonstrate comprehension of economic and cultural sustainability as well as architectural sustainability.

Assessment:

Students will research and produce reports on pueblo culture, sustainability, and how those topics relate to their own communities.

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Instructional Plan:

- 1. Watch the online video Emergence: Sky City Cultural Center.
- 2. Review the pages on the website Sky City Cultural Center and the Architecture of Acoma Pueblo.
- 3. Answer the questions for each learning module (5 in this series).
- 4. Research and produce a report on any New Mexican Pueblo's culture, to include: history, geography, cultural information, craft traditions, architecture, and a map of the pueblo's location in the state of New Mexico.
- 5. Research and produce a report on favorite aspects of sustainable design introduced in this series. Explain how you might use it today in your own community.

Reading Comprehension Questions:

- Name 5 modern Pueblos that attribute part of their ancestry to Chaco Canyon.
- Chaco's ancient roads connect it to...
- Did the environment play a role in why Chaco was settled at that place?
- What factors caused them to want to build there?
- What date were the great houses of Chaco built?
- How many stones were used in each great house?
- How long did people live there? Why did they leave?
- What aspects of design were used to help the buildings work with the sun and shed the cold winter winds?
- What are Chaco's essential Building Elements? Which is the one that was NOT used at Chaco that WAS used at Acoma?
- How many styles of stone masonry are used at Chaco and why are there different ones?
- How many trees did it take to build the great houses at Chaco?
- How far away did the Chacoans have to travel to get wood?
- What are the corner windows at Pueblo Bonito called and what was their purpose?
- Three types of agricultural fields were used in three different locations at Chaco.
 Describe each.
- What were the three man crops grown at Chaco?
- Are any of the methods of Chacoan agriculture used where you live today?
- Which ones? Are they growing the same things now that they were then?
- Did the Chacoans use irrigation? What kinds? Do these methods used nearly 1000 years ago relate to how irrigation is used in your community today?
- What is UNESCO and what work does the organization do? (requires outside research available online)
